Pre-Conference Class Descriptions

The following four classes are being offered through the Washington State Emergency Managemnt Division during the Pre-Conference Session of the 2002 Washington State SAR Conference.

ICS-300

May 13-15, 2002

An intermediate level national curriculum NIIMS ICS course covering incident and event organization and planning, resource management, air ops, etc. This course focuses on the management of extended operations. Priority to Law Enforcement Officers, SAR Coordinators, Overhead SAR Management Staff.

ICS-400

May 15-17, 2002

An advanced level national curriculum NIIMS ICS course. This is only the second time that an advanced ICS course has been offered.

SAR Incident Management

May 13-15, 2002

This course focuses on the first 24-26 hours of a SAR mission. It provides initial responding SAR Coordinators with the training they need to locate the subjects(s) as rapidly as possible while at the same time establishing the Incident Command System to expand the search operation if that becomes necessary. Priority to SAR Coordinators and volunteers with SAR Management responsibility.

Urban Search Operations

May 16-17, 2002

This course will focus exclusively on Search in the Urban Environment. Whether for Alzheimer's patients, missing children, crime victims, or evidence, searches in the urban environment are increasing in proportion to traditional wilderness operations in many areas throughout North America. Lost person behavior, search strategy and tactics, application of special resources, and other subjects related to urban search will be discussed.

All courses will be held at the 2002 Washington State SAR Conference training site. There is NO cost for tuition or student materials.

ELT's, EPIRB's & PLB's Demystified

May 15-17, 2002

Tuition \$30 • Class Size Limited to 20-25

This course has been designed to give SAR and Law Enforcement personnel real "hands on experience" with locating the source of emergency radio beacons. Covering 20-25 hours of instruction and field application, it permits each participant to become proficient and capable with radio direction finding techniques & theory.

Course topics include:

• Background of emergency beacons • Current and future systems • SAR Resources • Communications • Mobile (&

Aircraft) integration • Interferometers • Mapping • Terrain considerations • Field df'ing & signal strength
In addition to the classroom material, each registrant will get the opportunity to apply these techniques and principles in the field exercises that are an integral part of this course.

Please come prepared to work in the field no matter what the weather may throw at us. Raingear and good footwear are strongly encouraged.

Electronic Maps and GPS for SAR

Wilderness First Aid Considerations for SAR Managers and Sr. Field Responders

May 17, 2002 9 am - Noon

Tuition \$30 • Class Size Limited to 20

Aimed at SAR Managers & First Responders, EMTs, and Wilderness EMTs that want to better understand/address key medical issues in the field.

UTS Basic Tracking Course • Joel Hardin

May 13-15, 2002 • Tuition \$125

A tracking course especially for Novice and Track Aware students and open to all interested persons, previous tracking training or experience not limited or required. This will be a UTS Track Aware certification course for all eligible students.

Students will progress from initial identifying a print, to "step-by-step" every track concept of following an identified sign line and practical tracking team response.

Students should be physically fit and equipped for SAR field response. Students require a pen/pencil, note pad, small measuring tape, 5/8 inch doweling or similar, 36 to 40 inches long, with three rubber bands to use as a tracking stick and a three cell flashlight. Depending on availability, UTS will have textbooks (\$10), flashlights (\$10), measuring tapes (\$3) and footprint pins (\$15) for sale to students.

Simply Survival's teachings combine the art of learning wilderness survival techniques - new and old - along with an opportunity for self-discovery. If you are new to the wilderness, Simply Survival can teach you the basics... if you've had a lot of woods experience, Simply Survival can help hone your skills.

Pre-Conference Class Descriptions

SAR Helicopter Operations

Various agencies have been invited to participate with up to four hour training sessions. There is no charge for this series of classes – as there is no guarantee of aircraft availability.

Class is limited to 20. It is recommended that SAR Units not send more than one individual, which allows more units to benefit from this hands-on training. Invited agencies include Portland's LifeFlight, MAST (54th Dustoff), Coast Guard Group Astoria, Alph - 5th of the 159th (Chinooks), 36th Rescue Flight, and the 304th Combat Rescue Squadron.

Participants MUST have their own helmet with 3-point chin strap, goggles, hearing protection, full leather gloves, sturdy boots, long pants, and long sleeve shirt (Nomex if you have it).

Certified Training for Water Rescues

In conjunction with Rescue 3 NW and World Rescue Group, a Swiftwater Rescue Technician III course is being offered for rescue personnel and whitewater boaters. This pre-conference course is an intensive 3 and 1/2 day class held on location at the State S.A.R. facility and on the nearby Wind River May 14,15,16,17. Students must have swimming ability, be in good shape and come prepared with full wetsuit or drysuit (preferred), life jacket, helmet, knife, booties and gloves.

A manual, written test, field test(new), certificate of completion patch and I.D. card are included in the fee of \$350.00. As of 2002, students must achieve 80% overall grade to be certified to the Tech III level. Those who score less are certified at the Operations Level II.

This course meets the requirements of the NFPA 1670 Standard for Technical Rescue in water and rope and is certified by the International Rescue Instructors Association. Casey Garland, master instructor, teaches this course.

Modern use of the Remote Training Collar (Electronic Training Collar)

Day one - is for people and dogs who have never attended Lou's seminar and those who have and want more practice. Day Two - Is for those people and dogs who have attended Saturdays seminar or one of Lou's seminars in the past and want to continue their education.

This class will consist of a minimum of classroom work. Most of the time will be spent working the dogs and discussing what is going on during that training.

In this seminar all the myths and legends you have heard about Ecollars will be dispelled. This seminar will appeal to those who are opposed to the use of Ecollars, those who have never used one and those who have been using them for years.

There is no better, faster, more humane method of training a dog whether it be a family pet, a Police Service Dog, an Obedience Competitor, or a Schutzhund or other "biting sport" competitor; than a Remote Training Collar.

There is no method of training that is faster, or has more lasting results or is better at solving problems that inevitably occur, than a Remote Training Collar.

But just because someone has been training dogs for years does NOT mean that they can use a Remote Training Collar well. It's NOT the same as a leash and a correction collar. There are more differences than similarities in the use of those two tools of dog training. If you use the old leash and collar methods you will only scratch the surface of what can be accomplished with a Remote Training Collar. Remote Training Collars can also be used for solving such problems as dog to dog aggression, chasing cats, deer, skunks, or other "undesirable" animals. They can make a meek dog sure of himself, a fearful dog confident and unsociable dog friendly. This class is for handlers and dogs of all levels.

Class size limited to a MAXIMUM of 10 dogs on each day. There can be an unlimited number of observers.
